4. Print Competitions

As we near the end of the season my thanks go to Jacqui Titcombe who has been a great help over the past year.

Members who were successful in the print competitions and emerged with the best scores have been informed of their promotion to the Intermediate or Advanced class as appropriate. It has been decided that in future members will be permitted to enter 10 prints into print competitions i.e. 2 prints per competition. This is a change from previous practice when in the first competition only one print was permitted. This small change reflects the paucity of prints submitted in the recent past. The change also brings prints in line with pdi's and final results will be calculated in the same way to ensure consistency.

I am suggesting these changes as the current regulations, as shown on the APS Website, do not represent the actual situation in print competitions. I came to the conclusion that it is time to reconsider the rules and make some changes to reflect the situation regarding the lack of prints and to bring print competitions in line with the pdi competitions. (10 images with the lowest two scores disregarded to decided final total scores)

The rule changes will come into force at the beginning of the 2023/4 season.

Proposed changes to the APS Print Competition rules.

Regulations for Internal Competitions

Annual Print Competition Rules

Para 1.

There is a print competition each year comprising five rounds. A maximum of ten prints can be entered by a member into the print competitions. (i.e. 2 prints per competition round). The marks from the eight highest scoring prints will be used to determine the winner, second and third place in each class.

Para 2. The dates of each competition will be shown on the programme page of the APS Website and all Print Competitions will be open subjects. Print Titles, Author's name and unique corner identification number must be sent by email to printsec@amershamphotosoc.com by midnight on the Friday preceding each Monday competition evening. Each print must have the unique identifying corner, available from the Print Secretary at the start of each season, displayed on the top left hand corner of the print mount. Corners from previous years may not be used. The title and author of the image should also be clearly shown on the reverse of the image mount.

Any comments to the Print Secretary asap.







9. APS Covid guidance

The following APS guidance will be reviewed monthly by the committee. Please contact a committee member if you have any comments or suggestions relating to this guidance.

At the time of writing (January 2023) cases of Covid and other respiratory infections in the local population are abnormally high. Wearing a face mask

during APS meetings will remain optional. However while infection levels are high, to maximise personal protection, it is recommended that FFP2 or FFP3 grade face masks are worn by those that feel vulnerable.

Nobody should feel embarrassed about wishing to protect themselves by wearing a face covering. Under "How to help stop the spread of Covid 19" NHS advice states "wear a face covering when it's hard to stay away from other people – particularly indoors or in crowded places".
