

For our March programme:

4th March is our 4th print Competition and the judge is Peter Prosser APAGB currently a member of the CACC committee (and previous Chairman) and a member of Watford Camera Club. However, Peter has a long history in photography since he was about 11 years old, he subsequently joined Kodak as an engineer and managed the engineering required for the film and paper testing departments. He was involved in the Kodak Camera Club until he

retired. Peter says:

'I enjoy all images and subjects, monochrome, colour, "straight" or manipulated. Images need to be enticing to look at. They should engender emotion, a reaction, tell a story. We take photographs to please ourselves and others but above all, we should enjoy it and it should be fun"

11th March Members Evening to be devoted to the Photography of the late Paul Keene FRPS, MPAGB, EFIAP/Platinum, MFIAP.

Paul was a member and then Honorary Member of APS since the early 1980's until his recent death. His interest initially was wildlife but his subject matter expanded to include landscape, travel, portraiture, creative and street photography. Paul gained his FRPS in 1991, and was one of the first photographers to be awarded the MPAGB in 1995. He reached EFIAP platinum level in 2003 and gained MFIAP in 2014. Paul was a PAGB judge and judged many regional, national, and international exhibitions. Steve Brabner and Yin Wong have put together an evening celebrating Paul's work, including Steve telling us about his travel to China with Paul, on the invitation to Paul from a Chinese Photographic Organisation.

18th March is our 5th PDI competition and the judge is Julia Cleaver ARPS. She is a CACC Judge and Speaker. Julia says she loves to photograph people and nature in atmospheric ways and is often described as creative and having a painterly quality.

Julia has commented as follows:

'I create photographic images of nature mainly for fun and portrait photography mainly for work – which can be great fun. I especially love to create flattering and beautifully lit portraits '

25th March speaker Leigh Preston with his talk on Hugh Milsom Photographer. Leigh is FRPS (twice) EFIAP, MPAGB, and FIPF, he is a member of the Arena Group of Photographers and of the London Salon. His interest in photographer started when he joined the Ordnance Survey Photographic Society in the 1980's. A lot of his personal work is taken outside in isolated places or of buildings or landscapes that are well past their 'sell -by 'date. Leigh's talk will be about the beautiful landscape images of Hugh Milsom (FRPS, MFIAP, EFIAP /Diamond 2) one of the country's foremost landscape photographers. He says about Hugh's work and his talk

'The work is marvellous, superb landscape images from all over the UK both in mono and gentle colour, with some offshoot work in Iceland and the USA '

Also, in March on **Sunday the 17th** at Drake Hall are the CACC Championships in which APS are taking part in both the PDI and Print Competitions and the Chiltern Hundreds Competition which some of you have individually entered. Do consider attending and supporting APS.






8. Amersham Beyond Group

Another great evening of interesting photography filled the Pic Group's February meeting, and the attendance continues to grow!

To start we saw **Mike Kitchingman**'s recently successful Associate Visual Art panel, of architecture taken in Liverpool, tasteful lines and abstract shapes in monochrome.

David Harris then virtually filled our large display boards with an impressive set of colour prints, intended as the start of a possible Fellowship panel, the genre falling between Landscape, and Visual Art. The energy of the sea was very effectively communicated in the impressionistic slow exposure shots taken on Pembrokeshire beaches. The Group enjoyed much within the content, but also provided useful feedback and suggestions as to how to further improve and mature the panel.

After our break **Jaffer Bhimji** explained his interest and acquisition of a 58mm Helios lens which, via an adaptor, he mounted on his DSLR camera. The resultant soft ethereal printed images indicated that there is a lot of potential to be had when using alternative older lenses on digital cameras.

Finally it was nice to welcome back to the Group **Kathy Chantler** who wanted feedback and opinions on a storyboarded set of small prints, the product of happening upon an abandoned care home. The emotion and connection with the location, and it's associated sad demise, became clear as Kathy related her experience as she photographed. Had she been able to gain access to the property, rather than being restricted to external shots, the full potential of this opportunity might have been realised.







So once again a very varied set of presentations from our members. The next meeting is on March 21st, and we look forward to receiving offers to show work

on that evening.


10. Outings

12. ColorChecker monitor profiler

Print or PDI colours not as good as you'd thought they'd be?

Can't get all the colours correct on prints?

Tired of not getting it right?

Thinking of blaming your monitor but can't afford a new one?

Have you calibrated your monitor? If not, the APS ColorChecker Display can do this job.

It's simple to use and gives excellent results:

- Go to https://calibrite.com/software-downloads
 Download & install ccStudio.
- Plug the ColorChecker into a suitable USB socket on your computer.
- Run ccStudio & follow the instructions from it.
- The ColorChecker is hung on the front-centre of your monitor whilst it checks the monitor's colours.
- The programme will produce a colour profile for you to save to the computer.

All done in under 15 minutes.

APPENDIX

APS Covid Guidance

The following APS guidance is reviewed monthly by the committee. Please contact a committee member if you have any comments or suggestions relating to this guidance.

Wearing a face mask during APS meetings will remain optional. However when infection levels are high, to maximise personal protection, it is recommended that FFP2 or FFP3 grade face masks are worn by those that feel vulnerable.
