## 3. Programme

#### "Talk Sports" - 22nd April 2024

Warren Alani is a photographer based in Northamptonshire who first picked up his first camera as a teenager – a Zenit ET 35mm SLR. This was where his obsession with photography began. In 2009, Warren decided to turn his pasttime into something bigger. Taking the knowledge and skills he learned during his youth, he immersed himself in the new age of cutting-edge technology and turned his hobby into craft. In just a few short years, Warren has cultivated a clear artistic direction and a distinctive style in his work. His acute attention to detail has earned him recognition from national and international bodies such as The Royal Photographic Society and the Fédération Internationale de l'Art Photographique. Warren has also been awarded an honours distinction from the Photographic Alliance of Great Britain, as well as having his work displayed around the world at the Masters Of Print exhibition (for seven consecutive years), in the revered London Salon of Photography, and at his own exhibitions in the U.K. and in Europe. In 2022, Warren was awarded the FIAP Blue Pin for Most Acceptances at the world-famous Edinburgh Photographic Society's international exhibition.

His talk focuses on capturing the action in a very unique, creative way. In this presentation he will also share both techniques and tips that will help take you from standard imagery to striking pieces of work. His presentation features photographs from the world of athletics, para athletics, tennis, swimming, BMX and much more, both in the UK and internationally. Alongside the "Hero moments" are candid shots taken during the event, which highlights the

emotion of the athlete.

### 10. PIC Group

Another captivating evening filled with intriguing photography marked the PiC Group's March gathering, offering a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the successes of our members.

We kicked off the evening with a glimpse into the past as **Steve Smith** shared his 1984 Associateship panel, characterized by a pictorial genre. In those days, a set of twelve darkroom prints flush-mounted on black mount board was quite acceptable. It was apparent that cohesion played a lesser role compared to today, with the focus being more on individual images.

In stark contrast, **David Manning** presented his successful Associate Applied panel, capturing vibrant street scenes from Hong Kong a few years ago. Utilizing techniques such as shooting from the hip or without using the viewfinder, David displayed a stunning collection of street photography—a genre we hope to see more of within our group and in clubs.

Building on his Associateship panel, David also shared his latest work, which predominantly consisted of montages created by blending elements from multiple images. This innovative approach has garnered him considerable success at the club level, with many prints scoring a 20. While street photography traditionally adheres to strict guidelines regarding manipulation, David's creative montages offer a fresh if not controversial perspective on the genre.

Following the insightful presentations, **Sally Kitchingham**, a recent addition to our group, unveiled her successful Licentiate panel. Her collection showcased exceptional printing quality and compelling subject matter, exemplifying the standards expected at this level.

To conclude the evening, **Geoff Walker** treated us to a series of captivating black & white prints captured during his time in Venice. Seeking feedback and opinions on his series, Geoff received constructive suggestions regarding potential refinements. Suggestions included focusing on a more cohesive theme and perhaps revisiting Venice to further explore a concept suitable for a Travel panel.

As always, our meetings are enriched by the diverse talents and perspectives of


our members. We look forward to another inspiring gathering next month.

#### **APPENDIX**

#### **APS Covid Guidance**

The following APS guidance is reviewed monthly by the committee. Please contact a committee member if you have any comments or suggestions relating to this guidance.

Wearing a face mask during APS meetings will remain optional. However when infection levels are high, to maximise personal protection, it is recommended that FFP2 or FFP3 grade face masks are worn by those that feel vulnerable.

Nobody should feel embarrassed about wishing to protect themselves by wearing a face covering. Gov.uk guidance updated June 2023 states:

"Face coverings and face masks can help reduce the chance of you spreading infection to others, especially in crowded and enclosed spaces, and may protect you from becoming infected by some respiratory viruses."

Please do not attend a meeting if you feel unwell, have Covid or any other respiratory symptoms or have tested positive for Covid in the past week. We will not seek evidence of vaccination or negative tests. We rely on our members to act sensibly for the protection of others and themselves.
