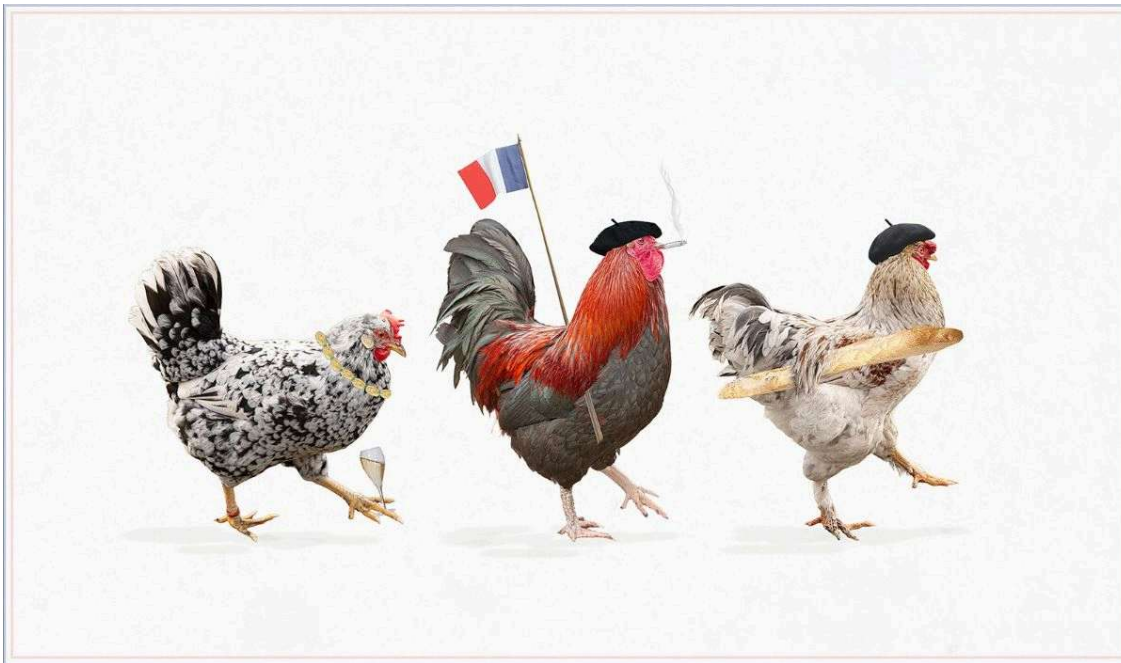

She was Chairman of the Licentiate panel from 2005-2019 as well as having other positions in the RPS. Rosemary also is a PAGB and SPA judge and has judged internationally as well as in the UK.

Rosemary says she focuses on the 'way I see it'..... with landscape she may be drawn to simplicity or the intimate landscape. With other subjects it's a case of whatever takes my eye'.

**Speaker; Julian Elliott - 23rd February on Zoom**

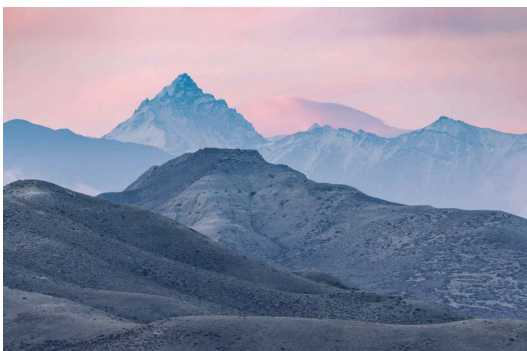

There was no outing in January but the photos from our December "Low Light" outing are now on the club Flickr page here:-

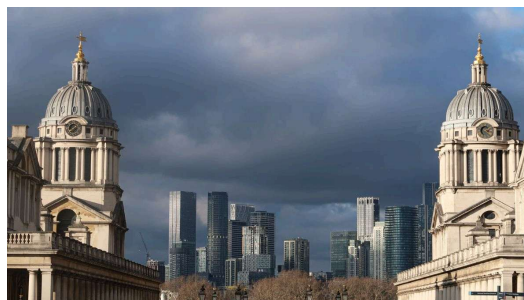
